When the announcement was made that Chi Omega would be having a softball tournament, Andrew Trevino made a guarantee that we would take home the hardware. Played at Clark Kerr softball field, Team TKE put on a show during the first game against Pi Kappa, putting up 13 runs and playing stellar defense to shut out the opponent. We took that momentum into our second round game against "tournament favorite" SAE. Armed with a reckless abandon, the TKE bats were even louder in the second game than in the opener. The live bats of TKE put up 15 runs, and the defense continued to hold up behind a masterful pitching performance from Frater Avi Baskin as TKE beat SAE in a 15-2 final count. But the work was not yet done. An inspiring pregame speech by

Coach Drew Flood got the championship game against Fiji started off right. The championship game was a rout, loaded with line drives in the trees behind the outfield, diving plays by Barrett Glasauer and Jason Wipaki, and great all around hustle from the team. TKE would go on to win the championship game 12-4. TKE never trailed at any point during the tournament, winning the 3 games by a combined score of 40-6. APRIL BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

On April 25th the Nu of Tau Kappa Epsilon Board of Directors, Advisors, and chapter leaders met at the Chapter House in Berkeley. Nu of Tau Kappa Epsilon is the California Non-Profit Corporation which owns and operates the chapter house. This meeting, one of four held throughout the year (not including the annual meeting in February), purpose is to discuss and make decisions regarding the Chapter House, and to report on the ongoing activities of the Chapter.

The highlights of the meeting including the report that there will be 49 Fraters living in this coming Fall semester, a high since re-chartering in 2004, but still well below the all-time record and legal maximum. The passage of a plan to ensure that every room in the house is renovated and brought up to date during a repeating five year cycle. And the discussion regarding the recent energy audit and possible actions to make the house "greener". The next meeting is August 23rd.
