MESSAGE FROM THE PRYTANIS

Since I joined the house, I have held the position of Sexual Violence Prevention Chair and served as the Chief Justice of the Judicial Committee. I was given the honor of serving as Prytanis for the 2019 year.

Thanks to the strong foundation left behind by the previous officer corps under the leadership of Prytanis Warren Pugash, we started this semester with excellent financial standing and high morale. Five out of eight officers this year started their terms as sophomores, and this has been a year where underclassmen have stepped up their involvement to help match the contributions of those who came before them.

The state of any organization often depends on its leadership, and I am proud to say that the new officer corps is off to a great start. Epiprytanis Patrick O'Sullivan brings wide-ranging experience to the table; he was Histor for the 2018 year. Histor Kyle Tucker does a great job with organizing historic materials and reaching out to alumni. Pylortes Leandrew Escobedo is an excellent risk manager, making sure our events remain safe for all. Finally, Hegemon Aidan Kingsford is devoted to helping the Alpha Kappa and Alpha Lambda pledge classes become the best Tekes they can be.

While all of our members are passionate about TKE, some of us have risen to important roles outside of the fraternity. In particular, we have increased our influence in the Interfraternity Council (IFC); three members are on the IFC Executive Board. Hegemon Aidan Kingsford is also the IFC Vice President of Internal Affairs. Daniel Lee is the IFC Vice President of Recruitment, and former Crysophylos Christian Medina is the IFC Vice President of Events Programming.

Our Tekes get involved in many other organizations besides IFC. Liam Howell, Josh Sparler, and former Hypophetes Will Ryan are President, External Vice President, and Vice President of Community Responsibility, respectively, of the CalGreeks Alcohol Task Force (CAT). They help make sure events across the Greek community are safe weekend after weekend. Angel Ramos is a Greeks Against Sexual Assault (GASA) Peer Educator, helping to inform the Greek community to stop sexual violence. Matt Chill is a project lead at Beacn, one of the most highly-selective consulting clubs on campus. And Garrett Wesley, notably, is a TA for CS61A, the most widely-taken computer science class at Cal.

This year, we plan to improve the operations of our chapter in a multitude of ways. We have developed our signature philanthropy event, TKE Trivia, into a fundraising powerhouse. Last semester all 14 sororities sent teams, and this semester's goal is to increase the amount of money raised for St. Jude Children's Hospital. Additionally, we are partnering with the Chi Omega sorority to bring back our popular event, Puppies and Pancakes. We anticipate it to be every bit as successful as TKE Trivia. Besides philanthropy events, we have a number of social events on the calendar. Our signature spring event, Tropic Thunder, will be held this weekend. Additionally, we have big plans for this year's Cal Day celebrations. Finally, we plan to amend the Chapter Constitution to better reflect the way the chapter currently operates.

The vision for 2019 is to improve Nu Chapter as much as possible and leave our mark on TKE. This house has given me so much in my time here, and I want to give back as much as I can. I look forward to the upcoming year!

MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICERS

DONALD C. ROMEO '57 (#388)

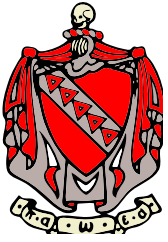
